Investment Trends

In 2022, private equity investments in African renewable energy hit \$7.6 billion, reflecting a substantial uptick and heightened sector interest, per AVCA.

Solar Power in North Africa

Private equity firms like Actis and Lekela Power are investing in North African renewable projects, such as a \$220 million wind farm in Egypt, to boost clean energy capacity and reduce fossil fuel reliance.

Off-Grid Solutions

CrossBoundary Energy and Persistent Energy Capital finance off-grid solar solutions, expanding energy access in remote areas through mini-grids and home solar systems.







Investec Asset Management funded Mobisol, an East African solar home system provider, expanding clean energy access to over 700,000 people in Tanzania and Rwanda.

Environmental Impact

Private equity firms, including Denham Capital, invest in African waste-to-energy projects like Ivory Coast's Abidjan Green Energy, turning municipal waste into electricity and reducing pollution and landfills.

The Africa Renewable Energy Fund (AREF), with support from Berkeley Energy, has played a pivotal role in increasing Africa's renewable energy capacity through significant investments.
